The competition, marking its 55<sup>th</sup> year, is awarded for creative accomplishment in the field of music composition and for the first time was open to composers currently living in Cuba. The Fellowship includes a \$20,000 award to carry out the composer's project as submitted. The blue-ribbon jury is comprised of national and international jurors of standing.

The CINTAS Fellowship Program encourages creative development in architecture & design, creative writing, music composition and the visual arts. The CINTAS Foundation was established with funds from the estate of Oscar B. Cintas (1887-1957), former Cuban ambassador to the United States, a prominent industrialist and patron of the arts. In June 2011, the CINTAS Foundation entered into an extended loan to MDC's Museum of Art + Design of the CINTAS Fellows Collection. It is comprised of nearly 300 pieces by artists of Cuban descent who have received prestigious CINTAS Fellowships awarded since 1963.
